**NSIC WOMEN'S CHAMPIONSHIP
SAT.-SUN, OCTOBER 10-11**

St. Paul, Minn. - The NSIC Women's Golf Championship tournament will be played on Saturday and Sunday, October 10-11 at Hillcrest Golf Course in St. Paul, Minn. The women's golf championship will consist of four rounds of 18 for a total of 72 holes for the championship. The first two rounds of 18 will be played this fall, while the final 36 holes will be played this spring.

OTHER WOMEN'S GOLF TOP PERFORMERS

Augustana's Kate Tobin (Jr., Eden Prairie, Minn.) continued her consistent play this fall at the 12th Annual Mustang Invitational over the weekend. Tobin put together rounds of 78 and 79 to finish in fourth place. It was her fourth-straight round under 80 and it was her second-straight top 4 finish.

Concordia-St. Paul's Anne Martin (Sr., Ramsey, Minn.) was at the top of the leader board after the first round as she found herself in a tie for 1st place with Upper Iowa's Jill Preeshl. Martin dropped from the top of the pack and finished 3rd after shooting an 81 in today's round, +6 strokes more than she had shot in the first round. Martin finished the tournament shooting a 156, +12 par. With her top-10 performance at the Mustang Invite, Martin achieved the 7th top-10 finish in her career at CU.

Northern State, competing without a fourth member due to medical reasons, did not qualify for the team standings at the Mustang Invite. Jessica Hoscheid and Jessica Simon tied to lead the Wolves with matching scores of 205 over the two-day event, both finishing in a tie for 89th place overall. Brittany Diegel finished with a 234, a score that placed her in 96th.

Upper Iowa's Jill Preeshl paced the squad with a 158 (75-83) and finished in a tie for 5th place after entering the day with a share of the lead. Laura Taylor was close behind with a 159 (78-81) to tie for 7th place. The Peacocks strung together a 321 on the first day and a 342 on the second for a score of 663. That score put Upper Iowa in 6th place for the tournament. McKenzie Holthaus carded a 164 (82-82). That score was good enough to tie for 20th. Freshman Calie Trusler came in with a 182 (86-96) and Kelly Rowe finished with a 200 (101-99). The Mavericks of the University of Nebraska-Omaha won the Invite with a 637 (322-315) after trailing the Peacocks by a stroke midway through the tournament.

St. Cloud State's Lee Zutz (Sr., Red Lake Falls, Minn.) led her team to the team title of the St. Benedict Fall Classic over the weekend. Zutz finished second overall with rounds of 79-82=161 on the par 72 layout. She was two shots back of the medalist. The Huskies put together strong back to back rounds of 334-351 for a 675 total to distance themselves from second place University of St. Thomas as the Tommies posted a 346-345-691. St. Cloud State led by 12 strokes after the first day and increased the lead by 16 strokes for the win. Sophomore Emily Kerber (St. Cloud) placed third overall after shooting rounds of 81-84 for a 165 total
