



NSIC WOMEN'S GOLFER OF THE WEEK

Taylor earned her first medalist honor of the year with a two-day total of 145 by following her first day even par 73 with a one under par 72 to win the UNO Fall Classic by six strokes. The senior finished tied for third place in par 3 scoring with a 2.88 average. Taylor also ended the tournament in first place in par 4 scoring at 3.94. She tied for third at 5.10 in par 5 scoring. Taylor led the field in birdies with 9 while tying for 8th in pars with 20. The top four Peacock golfers all placed in the top 20 as Upper Iowa claimed the runner up spot at the UNO Fall Classic. Upper Iowa was fifth in par 3 scoring with a 3.50 average, second in par 4 scoring with a 4.59 average, and second in par 5 scoring with a 5.48 average. The Peacocks carded the second most birdies (19) and the fourth most pars (81).

NSIC WOMEN'S CHAMPIONSHIP

St. Paul, Minn. - The NSIC Women's Golf Championship tournament will be played on Saturday and Sunday, October 10-11 at Hillcrest Golf Course in St. Paul, Minn. The women's golf championship will consist of four rounds of 18 for a total of 72 holes for the championship. The first two rounds of 18 will be played this fall, while the final 36 holes will be played this spring.

OTHER WOMEN'S GOLF TOP PERFORMERS

Augustana's Kate Tobin (Jr., Eden Prairie, Minn.) has been the Vikings' most consistent golfer this fall. In four tournaments she has shot between 76 and 82. She did that again at the UNO Fall Classic, shooting 77 and 81 to tie for sixth place at 158. Freshman Jennifer Benoy had a strong outing at the UNO Fall Classic. After competing as an individual in the first three tournaments, Benoy was among the Vikings' top 5 and responded with a 164, which was her best tournament score of the season.

Concordia-St. Paul's Kaytie Spangler (Jr., Ely, Minn.) led CU with a 77+82=159 to tie for eighth out of 56 women's individual golfers. Spangler moved up two spots in round two and finished the UNO Fall Invite in a tie for 8th place. The top-10 finish is the 9th of her career for the Golden Bears.

MSU Moorhead's Chelsey Ouren led the Dragons to a fourth place finish at the Husky Classic on Monday as she finished second overall, two shots shy of the leader. After being tied for second after day one, Ouren improved her strokes on the second day to take second place overall with a score of 159.

St. Cloud State's women's golf team placed second at the SCSU Husky Classic held Sunday and Monday at the St. Cloud Country Club. St. Cloud State senior Lee Zutz (Red Lake Falls) placed third overall. Zutz shot a 79 on Sunday and followed up with an 83 on Monday for a score of 161, four shots back of the medalist.

Wayne State's Katie Isom (So., Valentine, Neb.) was the top finisher for the Wildcats at the UNO Invite in Valley, Nebraska on Sunday and Monday. Isom finished in a tie for 26th overall after shooting 87 and 83 (a career-best) for a two-day total of 170.
